

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Introduction

The Memory Work Lapbook Resources were born out of a desire to provide my children with a fun way to review, retain and dig deeper into their memory work. We use our lapbooks at the table, in the car, during the school year and over the summer. While I provide instructions for how you might choose to assemble one, remember it is your own creative work, so feel free to improvise, add and remove whatever you find useful in your studies. You may want younger students to narrate the answers to the fill-in-the blank sections, and have an adult or older student print the answers for them.

Before You Get Started...

DO NOT PRINT THIS ENTIRE DOCUMENT!

Each section has instructions regarding the type of paper (regular weight or cardstock), recommendations on adding color, and if the page is to be printed front-to-back (or, if desired, printed separately and glued together). In addition, there are some resources with multiple options: You only need to print the version you want to use. For example, the scripture memory section will have you choose from the NIV (1984), or the KIV version using dashed cursive or print copy work; there is even a blank template to free-hand the scripture. You choose what works best for each child in your family! Lastly, beginning with page 45, there are additional foldables, book report forms, recipes, poetry templates, etc. to add to your lapbook if you desire. You may choose to add just a few, or all of them. It's up to you!

Interactive

This lapbook resource is meant to assist your child in learning the material and reviewing what they already know. Most of the templates have some element of interaction - meaning they require the student to demonstrate understanding of the information. It might be matching the terms, filling in the blanks, sorting groups of items, etc. You should find directions to complete the activities near each template.


Other Items


In addition to the resources provided in this product, you might also want to consider adding pictures from class, science experiment worksheets, art, or other items to your lapbook. A great way to add more space to your lapbook for additional items is to tape a piece of cardstock to the inside of one of your centersections. Tape most of the left side from top to bottom, flip the cardstock over and tape on the backside of the same section you just taped. This creates a page in your book. From there, you can glue or staple your additional resources to the book! If


Your lapbook is your own unique creation. However, if you'd like more direction on how you might assemble your lapbook, here is an example of one I put together:





MINI BOOK:


Print the Cover page (pg 23) - preferably on colored cardstock. Then print pages 24-26 on light-colored or white paper. After printing, complete the artwork. Once complete, cut along the dotted lines. Glue box 1 onto the center of the colored cardstock cover (pg 23). Fold in half along center seam. This is the cover. Open up to the blank back side. Take box 2 and fold in half with printed sides together. (Directions continued on next page...)




(Continued from previous page...) Glue the back of the left side of box 2 onto the blank left side of the cardstock so that the fold seams match. Fold box 3 with print side together. Glue the back of the left side of box 3 to the back of the right side of box 2. Repeat for box 4, 5, & 6 gluing the back of the left page to the back of the page before it. Repeat until the book is complete, and the back of the last page(perspective drawing), is glued to the right-hand side of the blank cardstock. Glue the back of your completed Art Book to the Lapbook!










For pages 27-33, CARDSTOCK STRONGLY SUGGESTED! Cut along the outside lines of the flaps. The dotted section becomes the binding for your flap-book. Staple and/or glue the dotted sections on top of each other. Be sure to line up the flaps in the correct order first. Then glue the back of the last flap onto your lapbook to secure the book to your lapbook. A picture of a completed book can be seen on page 4: first folder.


















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
